COVID Mandate Changes

New Zealand currently remains at RED. However, Cabinet are reviewing the framework colour level on Monday 4 April.

At the moment:

- There is no change to masks in education settings from the existing Red setting. Masks remain a requirement for staff working indoors with children and young people in Years 4-8.
- Masks are not required outdoors.
- Capacity limits will be removed for outdoor events and activities.
- Indoor capacity limits for extra-curricular activities increase to 200 people, or a









Tāwhaki - What's in my Kete?




