Weather

As we start the year, we need to be mindful of the weather. Currently we are being subjected to very changeable weather. This means that we need to prepare children appropriately. Play Lab

This year Bathgate Park School has been lucky enough to be 1 of 5 Dunedin schools to take part in Play Lab. Play Lab is a new initiative which is funded by Sport New Zealand's Disability and Inclusion Fund, to improve physical literacy and play opportunities in Otago schools for Tamariki with high and complex learning needs, through investment in Teacher Aide training and resources. The Play Lab is led by Sport Otago and supported by the Ministry of Education.

As part of this project, we have been lucky enough to get some line markings



created around our school for promoting physical activity. A huge thank you to Fulton Hogan for the line marking, which was started towards the end of Term 4 and completed in the holidays. As part of one of our Staff Only Days, both teachers and our wonderful learning assistants had the opportunity to be upskilled in a range of activities that used these resources. It has been so pleasing to see them already in use and for the wider school to be accessing them in break times. Amongst these we have a NZ Map; a maze; an exercise circuit around the outside of the tennis court; new basketball, netball and tennis court markings; four square and hopscotch centres; a hundred's board; an alphabet caterpillar; a ruler as well as a checker board. We will be working with Play Lab over the remainder of 2023.
