



Keeping Ourselves Safe Parent Evening

In weeks 9-11 we will be working through the Police programme, Keeping Ourselves Safe. This is a programme we explore every two years with students. Before we begin, we will be holding a parent information meeting to share the main ideas of the programme; outline what content will be taught in each area of the school, and answer any questions people may have. As part of this programme, Constable Greer, our Police Education officer will be taking sessions in all classrooms. Information about the meeting will be sent home separately, but please mark this date on your calendar. This is on Tuesday 25 March 5.30pm. Supervision will be available for children if you need to bring them.


In this programme they will learn:

- to work out when their safety is at risk
- how to keep safe when they meet and mix with other people
- who and how to ask for help if they, or someone they know, is being abused
- to go on asking for help until someone does something to stop the abuse
- that it is important to make and follow personal, family and school safety rules.

Attendance

The New Zealand government has placed a strong focus on increasing national school attendance rates, with the target of ensuring 80% of students being present for more than 90% of the term by 2030. We recognise the direct link between regular attendance and improved student outcomes. As such our school is committed to fostering a culture where attendance is valued and supported. We will continue to strengthen communication with families to understand and address barriers to attendance, provide engaging learning experiences that motivate students to come to school, and continue to provide a welcoming environment where every student feels a sense of belonging. Over the next weeks and terms you will hear about some of our new initiatives. We will also share regular snippets in future newsletters.


