Jenny Powell, "Dunedin Unesco City of Literature South D Poet Lorikeet", joined Bathgate Park School Year 0-1 pupils and their teacher Rachael Lawless recently, to write a poem about a teddy.

When Ms Powell introduced her threadbare teddy to the group at Bathgate Park School, one girl rushed away and found another bear in the classroom. The poet was not fazed, saying: "Teddy usually goes around by himself. But let's write a poem about Teddy having a friend."

After a discussion, the 5- and 6-year-olds started with: "Teddy feels happy. He is with a friend."

The suggested sounds the bears made included purrs and kisses, as well as growls, and activities included catching honey and fish.
